

Mandatory Packaging Reporting (MPR)

The National Environment Agency (NEA) initiated the MPR as part of Singapore's Resource Sustainability Act, with the objective to reduce packaging waste and promote sustainability.

The MPR framework requires businesses, including producers, importers, and retail suppliers, to submit an annual report detailing the types and quantities of packaging they introduce into Singapore. Additionally, these businesses must take steps to reduce waste by adopting a 3R plan focused on Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle principles.

Which Companies in Singapore are impacted by MPR?

This regulation typically affects the following groups:


- Importers of goods, packaging materials, and packaged products
- Manufacturers and packers registered in Singapore
- Brand owners with registration in Singapore
- Retailers operating within the country

Any business that meets the following criteria:

- Generates a turnover exceeding \$10 million
- Supplies regulated goods in Singapore
- Imports packaged goods or utilizes specified types of packaging



Packaging types to be reported



Service Packaging Packaging used at point of sales (e.g., bags, trays)

Primary Packaging

Packaging that comes into direct contact with the product (e.g., bottles, cans)

Secondary Packaging

Packaging used to group products together (e.g., cartons, shrink wraps).

Tertiary Packaging

Packaging used for bulk handling or transport (e.g., pallets, crates).

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Reporting requirements under MPR











Packaging Data Report

The type and quantity of packaging imported or produced by the business

Methodology Statement

A concise explanation of the data analysis, calculation techniques, and estimation methods employed to derive the packaging data

3R and Waste Reduction Plan

A well-defined strategy, execution plan, KPIs, and supporting evidence to demonstrate progress and achievement of the KPIs

Documentation Needs and Compliance

Keeping of records:

- Supporting evidence on data sources, and methodology for packaging data calculation, measurement and estimation
- Supporting documents that show progress of implementation of 3R plans
- Maintain records for a period of no less than 5 years and should be presented upon request to NEA for audits and verification

Penalty for non-compliance:

- First conviction: Up to \$5,000
